FROM CAIRO. THE GUERRILLAS ON THE MISSISSIPPI. Cairo, Oct. 22. The Memphis Bulletin, of the 17th inst., says: "About ten o'clock yesterday morning, as the steamer Continental, loaded with passengers and freight from above, was passing Island 21, this side of Point Pleasant, a blank shot was fired across her bow, from the Arkansas side, to bring her into shore. No heed was paid to the summons, and she passed on. Presently about fifty men were seen in sight, all beckoning for her to land; but Capt. O'Neal didn't heed the summons, when a twelve pound shot was fired at her, striking the water about ten feet to the side of the boat, glancing upward, and penetrating the "hold" about a foot above the water mark, lodging in a bale of hay. Of course the Continental "put out" from that place, but not before another shot, striking near her stern, had been fired at her. The damage to the Continental was fortunately trivial.
