A number of petitions of a private character were presented and appropriately referred. REPORT OF A COMMITTEE.
Mr. RIDGWAY, from the Committee on Corporations, reported, as committed, House Bill No. 295, an act to incorporate the Union League of Philadelphia.

MR. WILSON read in place, an act providing for the assumption by the Commonwealth, of debts contracted by wards, boroughs, townships, &c., by the expenditure of moneys as bounties to volunteers.
Referred to the Committee on Finance.
Mr. J. H. DONOVAN, an act to authorize the Governor to pay bounties to volunteers, during the present rebellion, and providing for sinking fund therefor by taxation of railroad and canal, and other companies.
Referred to the Committee on Finance.

Also, an act to erect a new Judicial district out of Lycoming and Clinton counties.
Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.
Mr. DONOVAN, joint resolution relative to the protection of fishermen in the waters of the Chesapeake and Delaware bays.
Referred to the Committee on Agriculture.
