EVENING EDITION.

Pennsylvania Legislature. REPORTED EXPRESSLY FOR THE TELEGRAPH.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. MONDAY, April 18, 1864.

The House met at 3 P. M., and spent the whole of the afternoon and evening sessions in the consideration of the bill proposing to increase the revenues of the State by additional taxation on railroads, banks, brokers, &c.

The bill, as passed finally, provides for a tax of two per cent. on the gross receipts of railroad companies, when exceeding sixty thousand dollars, and a tax of one per cent. when less than sixty thousand. Adjourned.

FROM EUROPE.

IMPORTANT NEWS.

New York, April 18. The steamer Glasgow has arrived from Liverpool on the 2d, and Queenstown on the 4th. Her news via Queenstown is somewhat later.

LONDON, April 4th. - The News reports that measures are being taken by the Tory opposition to muster its utmost strength for a well organized attack on the Government in Parliament.

The Times says the prospects of the Government have improved since the Easter recess; but there is a rock ahead, viz: the case of Mr. Stansfield, whose defence from the charge of connection with the late attempt on the life of Napoleon shall, it thinks, be made as a private member of Parliament, and not as a person connected with the Government.

Mazzini has addressed a letter to the Times exhorting Mr. Stansfield from any connection with the above named scheme of Grecco and others.

Consuls at 1 o'clock on the afternoon of the 4th, were quoted at 91 1/2 @ 91 1/4.

Advices from Rome confirm the apprehensions for the life of the Pope. His recovery is not, however, despair of.

Prince Napoleon, it is reported, will go to Sweden.

The Paris Pays speaks of a serious conflict said to have taken place in Jutland, between an Austrian and a Prussian regiment.

The Vienna papers give a positive and official denial to the report that a revolt had been planned among the Hungarian troops in consequence of the wholesale executions which had taken place.

The transfer of the Ionian Islands to Greece takes place on April 28th.

The Peking, one of the gunboats sent out to China for the Emperor, has arrived back at Plymouth.

The Department of the Susquehanna.

The Department of the Monongahela having been abolished, and annexed to the Department of the Susquehanna, Gen. Couch gives the following official notice on assuming command:

HEADQUARTERS DEPARTMENT OF SUSQUEHANNA, Chambersburg, Pa., April 12, 1864. The following extract from the orders of the War Department is published:

WAR DEPARTMENT, ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE, April 6, 1864. - The Department of the Monongahela will be annexed to the Department of the Susquehanna, and discontinued as a separate Department.

By order of the Secretary of War, E. D. TOWNSEND, Assistant Adjutant General.

In accordance with the above Order, the undersigned assumes command of that portion of this Department which has been annexed.

All orders and instructions from Headquarters Department of the Monongahela will remain unless otherwise directed. The current orders of these Headquarters will govern where there is a conflict of authority.

Officers whom this order affects, namely staff officers, commanding officers of bodies, and detachments of troops, including those of the Departmental Corps, will report their station and duties without delay to these Headquarters.
