WASHINGTON, May 12—8.15 p. m. To Maj. Gen. Dix, N. Y.—No dispatches from the Army of the Potomac have been received since 11.30 last night.

Boston, May 12. The Journal gives the following extract from a letter dated of New Inlet, near Wilmington, May 7th: Four rebel steamers came out last night. One was the rebel iron-clad North Carolina, similar to the Atlanta.
