## Don't Give Up the Ship.

Those who may entertain the idea that General Grant will be forced from his present position, except under the most pressing circum

stances, are mistaken. It appears among other things, that he would not be inclined to give up a field or a purpose on small provocation, but would be apt to contest it with the enemy till it was either decidedly won or decidedly lost. The

significance of such sentences as these is apparent.
