JOINT RESOLUTION proposing certain A spendments to the Constitutionus.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met. That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There shall be an additional section to the third, article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

follows:

"Section 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any acquai military serivice, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or, shall, be prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election."

SECTION 2. There shall be two additional sections to the elevantification of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

"SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Logislature, containing more than one subject, which shall, be clearly.

containing more than one subject, which shall, be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills? **CO.**
"Secture 9. No bill shall be pussed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grain such powers, or privileges, has them or may hereaster be, conferred upon the courts of this Commenwealth."
