THE NATIONAL CEMETERY-Design of the Soldiers' Monument.-The managers of the Gettysburg National Cemetery received fifteen designs for the monument to be erected at that place, and finally adopted one furnished by Mr. J. G. Batterson, of Hartford, Conn. He is the architect whose design for a monument to the volunteers of Pennsylvania, who fell in Mexico, was adopted by the Legislature of Pennsylvania some years ago, and a conditional contract made for its construction, but which afterwards failed for want of an appropriation.

Some of the principal features and combinations, which were used in the design for the monument to the Pennsylvania volunteers, who feil in: Mexico, are incorporated in the design an opted for the Soldiers' National Cemetery. The material proposed to be used in the white granite. Around the base of the monument are four statues representing, severally, war, history, peacs and plenty. The column is surmounted with a statue representing the Genius of Liberty, holding in one hand the laurel wreath, and in the other the American flag. The whole height will be sixty-five feet.

The work of enclosing the cemetery has been going on for several weeks, and it is expected that the whole grounds will be enclosed this summer, and the gravestones all put in place.

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing certain mendments to the Constitution. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assem-by met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof: There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows: "Scortox 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military ser-vice, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth; such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or shall be prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election." Skornov 2. There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows: "Skornov 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills." "Skornov 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be, conferred upon the courts of this Commenwealth."
