The Imperial Progress.

Santa Anna to be Field Marshal. Frigate Dispatched to Convoy Him to Mexico.

By the arrival of the Eagle, from Havana we are furnished with further details of the reception of Maximilian at Vera Cruz and

his progress towards the Capital.

The French journals of Vera Cruz say that the reason the ladies of that city appointed no deputation to wait upon the Empress, was because they were so little accustomed to royal visits. The Empress was informed of this and expressed herself perfectly satisfied

with the explanation.
The Emperor had not arrived at the City of Mexico at the latest dates. Great preparations were making there by General Bezzine and the municipal authorities for his reception.

A ship of war is to be sent from Yers Cruz to Havana to convey with all possible honor to the Mexican shores Santa Anna, in his new

capacity of Field-Marshal of the Empire. It is expected that the Austrian frigate Novara, the same in which the Emperor and Empress crossed the ocean, will be selected for the Senor Francesco Xavier Miranda, until re-

cently prominent in Mexican affairs, has died at Puebla. It is stated by the journals in the French interest that great distress prevails at Monte-

rey. Provisions are getting scarce and the merest necessaries of life are at enormous The present Governor has imposed a large ced loan on the States of Nueva Leon and Conhuala.

The Prefect of the army has announced that at the defeat of Doblado by General Mejia, the latter lost 800 prisoners, 18 cannon one flag and all his camp equipage, besides leaving many of his dead on the field.

Arrival of Gen. Stahl at Mar tinsburg With Twelve Hundred Prisoners.

Thousand Ei Prisoners Captured by Hunter.

Martinsburg, W. Va., June 16. The Army Appropriation Bill.

Washington, June 17. The army appropriation bill, which has just become a law, provides that "all persons of color who have been, or may be, mustered into the military service of the United States shall receive the same uniform clothing, arms and equipments, camp equipage, rations, medical and nospital attendance, 1 ay and emoluments, other than bounty, as other soldiers of the regular or volunteer forces of the U. S., of the like arm of the service, from and after the first of January, 1864, and every person of color who shall hereafter be mus. tered into the service shall receive such sums in bounty as the President shall order in the different States and parts of the United States,

All persons enlisted and mustered into the service as volunteers, under the call dated October 17, 1863, for 300,000 volunteers who were at the time of enlistment. actually enrolled and subject to draft in the State in which they volunteered shall received from the United States the same amount of bounty, without regard to color.

All persons of color who were free on the 19th day of April, 1861, and who have free enlisted and mustered into to military service of the United States shall, from the time of their enlistment, be entitled to receive the pay, bounty and clothing allowed to such persons by the laws existing at the time of their enlistment; and the Attorney General of the United States is hereby authorized to determine any question of law ansing under this provision; and if the Attorney General aforesaid shall determine that any such enlisted persons are entitled to receive any

pay, bounty or clothing in addition to what they have already received, the Secretary of War shall make all necessary regulations to enable the pay department to make payment in accordance with such determination. All enlistments bereafter made in the regular army of the United States, during the continuance of the present rebellion, may be for the term of three years.
