OFFICIAL REPORT OF GENERAL SHERIDAN been received. He reports a victory over the enemy at Trevillian station on the Virginia Central railroad a few miles south of Gordons ville, where Gen. Lee a few days ago reported a rebel victory. The official report is as fol-

lows:

"I have the honor to report to you the arrival of my command at this point, and also to report its operations since leaving New Castle Ferry. I crossed the Pamunky river on the 7th inst., marching via Aylett's, and encamping on Herring Creek.

On the morning of the 8th I resumed the march via Polecat Station, and encamped three miles west of the station.

On the 9th I marched through Chilesburg and near Matchett, encamping on E. N. E. Creek, near Young's bridge.

On the morning of the 18th, General Tor-bert with his division and solones Gregg's.
