Movements of General Hunter. The Capture of Lexington. Advance on Lynchburg.

[From the Petersburg Express of the 14th.] The South side train which reached here yesterday morning, brought the Lynchburg papers of yesterday, which we presume were put to press Saturday night or Sunday forenoon. We copy from them several items relative to the movements of Crook and Averill, the ranked raiders. The Virginia says:

This city was thrown into a considerable state of excitement on Saturday afternoon by the news received from various quarters. It was definitely ascertained that a party of Yankee cavalry, said to be about one thousand—though there could be no certainty as to their exact numbers—were within four miles of Arrington depot, Orange and Alexandria railroad, about twenty-eight miles from this city.

The Richmond Enquirer of yesterday reported that the Rebels had captured the Petersburg and Richmond railroad track, near Wall-hill Junction. Early's (late Longstreet's) Corps crossed the James river near Drury's Bluff in strong force, and was seen coming through the Petersburg turnpike as Gen. Butler's forces entered their works.

The reported advance of the enemy on Lexington and Lynchburg produced but little, if any, sensation among our people on Saturday. Our vigilant and able commandant, General Crook, in order to meet any demonstration which might be made in this quarter, and we think our citizens may rest perfectly secure in view of our means of successful defense.

The Richmond Enquirer of yesterday reported that the Rebels had captured the Petersburg and Richmond railroad track, near Wall-hill Junction. Early's (late Longstreet's) Corps crossed the James river near Drury's Bluff in strong force, and was seen coming through the Petersburg turnpike as Gen. Butler's forces entered their works.

A portion of Averill's forces is reported, in well informed quarters, to have diverged from the Lexington stage road, at Fairfield, and crossed the Blue Ridge into Nelson county. Here they are said to have made a descent upon the Lynchburg and Charlottesville railroad at Tyne River bridge, twenty-four miles from Lynchburg, where they burned the bridge and committed other excesses.

We conversed with a gentleman yesterday, who reached here direct from Lynchburg by the morning train of the South Side Railroad. He states that the enemy were reported to be within seven miles of Lynchburg Sunday afternoon, at a point on the Orange and Alexandria railroad, known as Melver's. They had also visited Arrington, Amherst C. H., and Tyne River, all in the same road, at the last mentioned of which they destroyed the bridge.
