WHEN WHEAT SHOULD BE CUT.-There is a difference of opinion among farmers as to the proper time for cutting wheat. Those who have investigated the matter are convinced that the grain should be taken off before the heads are fully ripe, and the following reasons are given:

Wheat is composed of gluten, starch and bran. Gluten is the nourishing quality of the grain, makes the flour stick together in the hands of the baker, and gives weight to the grain-and there is the greatest quantity of gluten in the grain just when the straw is yellow two or three joints from the ground, the head turns downward, and you can squeeze a grain between your fingers without getting any milk from it. Every day the wheat stands after this stage of its ripeness, the gluten decreases in quantity, and the bran increases in thickness.
