Later from Gen. Sheridan. WASHINGTON, June 28. The steamer Osage, a Vanderbilt arrival here, bringing up 153 Miss. Volunteers, Col. Bates, 183 officers and men, whose term of service has expired.

From Washington. ABOLISHMENT OF THE DRAFT COMMUTATION BILL. WASHINGTON, June 28. The House passed the bill to-day abolishing commutation bill as it reads. This is not Sherman's bill, and there are certain provisions which, if complied with, will enable those desiring it to avoid the draft.
