> BLACKBERBY CORDIAL --- To 1 gallon blackberry juice put 4 lbs. of white sugar; boil and skim off; then add 1 oz. of cloves, 1 oz. of cinnamon, 10 grated nutmegs, and boil down till quite rich; then let it cool and settle; afterwards drain off, and add 1 pint of

The wine and jelly are made just as currant wine and jelly are. Almost all housekeepers are familiar with the modes of making these. The syrup is made like the jelly, but not so rich; only rich enough to keep well. Let it become cold before pouring it into bottles. If it should form jelly, beat it over and put it up in jars. A gallon of syrup or jelly may save as many lives as the same quantity of cordial, rum or brandy ; for if stimulants are needed they may be given to the patient separately.
