EVENING EDITION. Later from Europe. THE CAPTURE OF THE PIRATE GEORGIA. THE SUCCESS AT MOBILE. Opinions of the English Press.

New York, Sept. 6. The steamer Scotia, which arrived with Liverpool dates to the 27th, via Queenstown on the 28th ult.

The London Daily News and Morning Post both have editorials showing that the seizure of the Georgia was legal, and that the British Government cannot interfere, as a Confederate war vessel could not legally be sold in a British port.

The London Times also editorially questions whether the Republicans are any more inclined for recognition or reconciliation than they were a year ago.

The weekly returns of the Bank of France show an increase in cash of 4,333,000 francs.

The Liverpool Courier editorially says that Mr. Bates did not purchase the Georgia. All the custom's authorities informed him that she should be registered as a British vessel, and she was accordingly registered.

The Army and Navy Gazette admits that a Federal success at Mobile, even in its present proportions is considerable, and as regards peace it declares its belief that the existence of a peace party is mythical, and that as long as there is a ray of hope the North will march onward to its end empire.

Arrests continue to be made in Italy, owing to an illegal conspiracy to detach Italian Tyrol from Austria. The funeral of eight persons, killed in the Geneva boats, passed off quietly without a renewal of the disturbances.

From the Shenandoah Valley. HARRIS' FERRY, Sept. 5. The ubiquitous Mosby is around again. An ambulance train of thirty-five wagons which started from here yesterday were all except four captured by that guerrilla.
