PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 3. The opening figure for gold was 228, a decline of 20 per cent. from the opening figure of yesterday, which has checked the upward movement in breadstuffs, and there is less doing; sales of 4,000 bbls. flour at \$11 75/100.

NEW YORK, Nov. 3. The exchange will be effected at the mouth of Red river. The rebel officer also informed Gen. Lawler that a Captain Lee, of Quantrell's guerrillas, with 100 desperadoes, dressed in Union uniforms, was just beyond Atchafalaya river, and that the rebel Gen. Smith had sent word to his Col. Commanding that district not to recognize nor permit them to cross.

ANOTHER meteor has fallen at Hubbardstown, Mass. It was discovered on the 9th ultimo, and on examination proved to be a mass as large as a hoghead, of a gelatinous, light-colored semi-transparent substance.
