FROM KENTUCKY.

Forrest's Army on the Retreat. CAMO, Nov. 12. Advice from Paducah to the 9th say that the rebels disappeared from this side of Johnsonville. No portion of Forrest's army was believed to be on the east side of the river, they having gone it was supposed to join the rebel army under Hood. Gen. Schofield with 1,500 U. S. troops, arrived at Johnsonville, and that place was regarded as perfectly secure. The Tennessee river will soon be open again. A tornado passed over Washington county, Illinois, on the morning of the 9th, destroying many buildings and killing one person and wounding several others. Several steamers have arrived here from below, bringing four hundred bales of cotton, for St. Louis.
