Mr. Stevens' motion was decided in the negative; yeas 51, nays 48. The vote by which the bill was referred was reconsidered; yeas 65, nays 41. The question thus recurring on the question to refer the bill to the Committee of Ways and Means, Mr. Stevens moved to postpone its consideration for ten days.

Mr. Blaine moved to lay the bill on the table. This was carried; yeas 73, nays 52. Markets by Telegraph. PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 7. The advance in the price of gold has had no effect on the breadstiff market, and there is very little doing. There is very little export demand for flour, and only 800 bbls. sold at \$11 @ 11 50 for extra, and \$12 @ 12 25 for extra family. Receipts small. Rye flour is scarce and firm at \$9. In corn meal nothing doing. The wheat market is inactive; red at \$2 60, white at \$2 70 @ 85. Rye commands \$1 75 @ 1 75. Corn is in no better demand, as to the market for old wheat, for old yellow, \$1 70 for new do, and \$1 85 for old white. Oats are in good request, and 5,000 bushels sold at 91 @ 92c. No change in barley or malt. Provisions and groceries are quiet. Petroleum moves slowly owing to the absence of supplies; sales of crude at 46 @ 47c, refined in bond at 78 @ 79c, and free at 85 @ 86c. Residium is held at \$9. Whisky sells slowly at \$1 31, and Ohio at \$1 32 @ 33c.
