From the Baltimore Sun. The Legislature of South Carolina has met and adjourned, and a Convention chosen by the people of that State will assemble on the 17th of December, to consider the action which shall be taken by the State.

On the 11th of June, 1776, Congress resolved that a convention should be assembled to prepare and digest the form of a confederation to be entered into between the Colonies, and on the 15th of November, 1777, the articles of confederation initiated by that convention were agreed to, and provision was made for their submission to the Legislatures of the several States.

There were parties in the convention of 1787 who differed radically in theory and desire, and whose differences in theory subsisted even after they had agreed upon the forms of language which they would adopt in common.

therein, solemnly proclaim to the world their right of secession, whenever they thought the emergency required. These two States were emergency required. These two States were emergency required.

It cannot be doubted that Virginia and New York, at least, by the solemn act of their State conventions, practically affirmed this right in 1788. They prescribed no formula by which it should be put into operation, if the occasion required.

And so it is with the secession of South Carolina and other Southern States. They may generate a revolution if they are constrained by force to remain in this Union. If they are not so constrained, the result will be, not a revolution, but some other ending, no more unexpected to the country than the Constitution of 1787 was to the men composing the Federal Congress of 1786.
