MR BENTON'S bill to and in the construction of th Lake Ostario, Auburn and New York railroad. provides for the imposition of one-twelfth of a mill tax for the years 1861 and 1862-\$50 000 of the proceeds to be paid to the company when they have constructed 22 miles of the road to Weedport -\$50,000 when constucted to Auburn, and the balance of the moneys raised by the tax when the balance of the road is finished .- Albuny Argus.
