THE MAILED.—Under the change of schedule on the different railroads, the time of closing the mails at the Harrisburg Post Office, December 1st, 1860, is as follows:

FRINDISH AND HORRIBLE MURDER IN JUNIATA COUNTY.—One of the most brutal murders we recollect ever hearing of, occurred in Black Dog Valley, Fayette township, about midway between M'Alisterville and Richfield, and three miles east of Siltzer's Mill, Juniata county, on Saturday evening last, and which resulted in the death of an aged and esteemed citizen named Henry Auker, over 70 years old.
