"The funeral has taken place without disturbance; a cortege of more than 100,000 persons passed quietly in front of the Russian picquet, who presented arms. Public emotion has, happily, taken the direction of a legal manifestation. A petition to the Emperor is under signature. The initiative has been taken by men of the highest rank; among them are three marshals of the nobility. The petition requests the re-establishment of the constitution of 1815, which has been suspended for thirty years. The number of signatures is immense. A compromise may, therefore, be expected. Nevertheless, a great number of Polish officials have sent in their resignations.

"The disturbances have produced a deep sensation at Berlin and throughout Germany. The government begins to understand that Poland is not dead, and that it is not so easy as they imagined to suppress patriotic sentiments in a nation of 15,000,000 souls, which, not speaking the language of their masters, and not professing the same religion, keeps its patriotism continually alive in the glorious reminescences of its independence and in its aspirations towards a future and liberty."

PROPOSED RECOGNITION OF THE CONFEDERATE STATES.-In the British Parliament, on the 4th inst., Mr. Gregory gave notice that on an early day he would call the attention of her Majesty's government to the expediency of a prompt recognition of the Southern Confederacy of America. Whatever may be the wishes of people on

this side of the Atlantic, there is little doubt what will be the ultimate determination of the government of Great Britian on this subject. The tone of the English press has been essentially modified, in treating the question of slavery, since secession in the United States became a fixed fact. In their estimation, the iustitution of slavery seems to be far less obnoxious than formerly; less repugnant to humanity; and to be tolerated as a necessary evil, rather than to be cut up with fire and sword, regardless of all consequences. One might almost detect a growing fondness for the long abused slaveholders, who don't turn out to be such a barbarous set, after all. The truth is, England considers her commercial interests paramount to all others; at least, they are of more importance than an exploded dogma with which she has no possible concern: and if any substantial benefits can be obtained by currying favor with the Confederate States. she will not be slow to seek them. Now that she must contend with the Morrill Tariff, the motive for recognizing the independence of the seceded States, operates with a power prodigiously increased. If the Republicans had desired a recognition by foreign powers of the Southern Confederacy, they could not have done anything better calculated to secure this end, than was their adoption of a high protective taxiff .- Journal of Commerce.

HOW THE FRENCH DETECTIVES TRACK CRIMINAL -Nothing exceeds the ingenuity of the French police detective when in pursuit of a criminal. Science as well as cunning is efficiently brought to bear in his investigation, as a proof of which the following may be adduced: The footprint left on the soil by the fugitive from justice is worthy of preservation, and great care is necessary in the process for chtaining an accurate cast of it. The detective goes to work in the following wise: A gridiron of several inches elevation is placed over the footprint, and covered with a sheet of copper. Ignited coals are then added, which heats the copper by conduction and the soil by radiation. **Spermac**eti, reduced into an impalpat le powder by means of solution in hot alchohol, being throws into a large quantity of cold water, is sprinkled over the heated footprint. It melts on contact, and the sprinkling is continued until the necessary thickness for a complete cast is reached. After cooling, the cast is carefully dag out. The size of the shoe, its neculiarities and imperfections, are thus accurately obtained for comparison, when opportemity shall offer.

SCHOOL REBELLION .- At Chicago last week, the board of education appointed a Mr. Spofford principal of one of the public schools, in place of a Mr. Benham, removed. On Thursday, Mr. Spofford was introduced to his charge by a member of the board of education, but the big boys would'nt stand him, and the big girls (styled "young ladies," in the report before us) steed by the boys, and joined them in hissing the new master. The representative of the beard attempted to explain to the rebels the exceeding wickedness of their behavior. This the boys could not be made to understand, and they began to make preparations for throwing the principal out of the window, but he armed himself with a pole, and with it kept them at bey, until he found an opportunity to escape. On Friday the school house was not opened .-On Saturday it was re-opened, but the spirit of mutiny raged still hotter, the building was stoned, and the police were summoned, and actual violence thereupon ceased.

FROM GRAVE TO GAY.—The custom of attending funerals for the purpose of getting a grataitous carriage ride, and for enjoying one's self in "a promiscuous manner generally," has became so annoying and scandalous in Cincinnati that several beneficial societies of that city have adopted resolutions not to attend funerels unless the number of "mourners" are restricted to the immediate family and friends of the decedent. Appended to a funeral invitation which appeared in the Cincinnati papers of Saturday was the following notice; "The friends of the deceased will also take notice that the Society will not attend if there be more than six carriages and hearse at the funeral."

FATAL AFFRAY IN TEXAS.—We learn that an affray occurred in Texana, Jackson county, on Wednesday, the 6th inst., between Mr. Woolfolk on ene side, and Messrs. C. M. Flournoy and R. S. Flournoy on the other. Several shots were exchanged with effect, the first named gentleman being killed, and the elder Flournov severely wounded. The Flournoys were arrested, and upon examination before Judge Jones, were admitted to bail in bonds of \$5,000 and \$10,000. This painful affair has created great excitement in the country. The Grand lary being in session at the time, a bill of indictment for murder was returned against the Flournoys .- N. O. Crescent.

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
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
