He spent the whole of Saturday night at the Third and Walaut street ontrance to the Capitol grounds, pacing leisurely up and down the povement like a sentinel on duty, regardless of the falling rain. Having committed no offence against the civil laws, the keeper of the prison transcended bis duty in receiving them into that institution without commitments from a civil magistrate. If there is no proper military guard house in this city it is the dury of government to provide one. The large f ree of soldiers now here is certainly sufficient to guard two securely troped prisopers, without thrusting chem into* prison. We did not learn where the deserters came from, or to what regiment they belong.


