WAY MAIL.—For all places between Harrisburg and Philadelphia, at 6.30 a. m.

WEST-WAY MAIL.—For all places between Harrisburg and Lancaster, at 12.10 p. m.

NORTH-WAY MAIL.—For all places between Harrisburg and Washington, D. C., at 3.00 p. m.

LEBANON VALLEY RAILROAD.—For Mechanicsburg, Carlisle, Shippenburg and Chambersburg, at 6.00 a. m.
