PENNSYLVANIA NEWS.

VENANGO COUNTY.—The branch line of the Atlantic and Great Western railroad is completed from Meadville to Franklin. The first locomotive which ever entered the county was to make its appearance on Saturday, May 27th.

A company is being formed to erect a telegraph line from Tyrone to Conowingo.

Col. James K. Kerr, lately commanding the Fourth Pennsylvania cavalry, has resigned his commission on account of ill health.

The Democracy of the county held a grand mass meeting at Franklin, May 27th, at which it was addressed by Hon. William H. Witte, Hon. S. A. Gilmore, and others.

Democratic clubs have been formed throughout the county, and weekly meetings are held in all the townships.

CENDE COUNTY.—The extreme drought for a week or two past has completely parched the mountain forests, and a letter from Penn's Valley says that an immense conflagration is now raging on what is known as "The Mountain," resulting in great destruction of property and interrupting travel.

The Bellefonte and Lewisport railroad is unable to perform its daily trips.

YORK COUNTY.—Mr. William Klinefelter, of Shrewsbury township, met with a severe accident a day or two since at the Northern Central railroad depot. It appears that whilst endeavoring to step from one of the cars on to the trolley, he fell between them, the wheels passing over his right foot and hand, smashing them in a terrible manner.

On Wednesday morning last Barney Conley, an employee of the railroad company, received a severe internal injury by falling heavily upon a pile of iron.

THOS UNDERWOOD, of York, had his right foot painfully injured last Saturday by the wheels of the Laurel fire engine passing over it.

Miss Mary Smith, a daughter of Mr. William Smith, druggist, aged about nine years, met with a very serious accident, falling from the hayrack of Dr. Roland's stable, one day last week, whilst at play with some of her companions.

Mr. Henry Mandorf, a survivor of the noble band who marched to Baltimore from York in 1814, to repel the British invasion, died in that place on Friday last, aged 82 years.

The portion of the 13th regiment from the borough of York and vicinity arrived there about four o'clock on Saturday afternoon, and were received in a becoming manner.

MISCELLANEOUS.—The Democracy of Clarion county has instructed their delegate, Hon. C. L. Lambertson, to vote for Clymer.

The quantity of anthracite iron made in Pennsylvania, east of the mountains, during the year 1862, is stated at 381,448 tons, against 310,000 tons for 1861.

Mrs. Catherine Smith, aged 93, one of the oldest residents of Lancaster, died in that city on the 25th.

At a Democratic mass convention, held at Ridgeway, Elk county, Dr. C. R. Early, of Elk county, was recommended for Senatorial delegate, and T. Jefferson Boyer, of Clearfield, and Seth A. Baucus, of McKean, as Representative delegates, to the State Convention in June.

The 126th regiment of returning nine months' men was a grand reception at Chambersburg on Saturday last.

On Sunday, the 17th inst, the dwelling house at Hart of Mr. James Spencer, of White township, Indiana county, were totally consumed by fire. His loss is over \$1,000.

At a county meeting of the Democracy of Snyder county, held at Middleburg, on the 26th inst, several speeches were made by Messrs. Ziegler and Purdy, of that county, and Hon. Wm. H. Witte, of Montgomery. A resolution instructing the delegates to vote for Mr. Witte for Governor was unanimously adopted.

A Pennsylvania girl, who has been serving as a soldier in the Army of the West for ten months, says she has discovered a great many females among the soldiers, one of whom is now a lieutenant. She has assisted in burying three female soldiers at different times, whose sex was unknown to her but herself.

A son belonging to Mr. Moses S. Miller, of Windsor township, Berks county, gave birth recently to four calves. Two of them were dead but the other two are strong and healthy.
