

MENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTIO A

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING CER TAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITU TION

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of h presentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylv nia in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with th provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There shall be an additional section to t third article of the Constitution, to be designated ted as section four, as follows:

SECTION 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in as actual military service, under a requisitio rom the President of the United States, or h he authority of this Commonwealth, suc electors may exercise the right of suffrage all elections by the citizens, under such reg ations as are, or shall be, prescribed by lat as fully as if they were present at their usu place of election.

There shall be two additional sections to th eleventh article of the Constitution, to be de signated as sections eight and nine, as fo lows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by th Legislature containing more than one subject which shall be clearly expressed in the title except appropriation bills.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by th Legislature granting any powers, or privile ges, in any case, where the authority to gran such powers, or privileges, has been, or ma hereafter be, conferred upon the courts of this Commonwealth.


