

They are revolutionists just as truly as the man against whom the nation is in arms, and though their disloyalty takes on a different form, it is none the lass overt, and tends practically to a fatal concurrence with the designs and hopes of the armed sedition "

MENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION. A

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING CER-TAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITU-TION.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four, as follows:

SECTION 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by he authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of sufrage in all elections by the citizens, under such reguations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election.

There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as fol-

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Logislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be, conferred upon the courts of this Gommon wealth: JOHN CESSNA,
