German Refugees. J. M. Beck, formerly of Harrisburg, Pa., has written a letter to the Union of this city, describing the events which led to his arrest as a rebel by the government of Baden.

Important from Switzerland. The Assemblée Nationale says: The three courts of Berlin, Vienna, and St. Petersburg, and the Germanic Confederation have addressed to the French Government a note relative to the affairs of Switzerland.

From Liberia. A letter from President Roberts, of the Liberian Republic, announces the purchase of Grand Cape Mount and Manna by the Government, and the hope of being able to extinguish the slave trade at Gallinas.

The mortgaged Oligarchy. Mr. D'Israeli says, on the authority of a London Attorney, the amount of the mortgages of England is £400,000,000, producing at 4 per cent, £16,000,000 a year.

Mr. D'Israeli is likely to be in communication with attorneys and landlords competing for the mortgage of the subject of mortgages.
