Illegal Fees.

The Bulletin calls the attention of all receivers as well as payers of illegal fees, to the following section of an act passed in 1831, which seems generally to have been overlooked. It will be perceived that the consequence of receiving such fees is not a mere petty pecuniary penalty, but a removal from office, which, under the Constitution, follows a conviction for a misdemeaner in

2. Sect. 1. If any officer, whose fees are expressed and limited in and by an act of assembly of this commonwealth, passed the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand 13 eight hundred and fourteen, entitled, "An act establishing a fee bill," or in and by an act passed the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, entitled, "An act to alter and amend the fee bill," or in and by any other act or acts of assembly of this commonwealth, at any time" hereafter, shall wilfully, fraudulently, and corruptly charge or demand, or take any of the fees, in and by any of the raid acts, limited and ascertained, where the husiness for which such fees are chargeable, shall not have been done and performed, or if any officer-shall-wilfully, fraudulently and corruptly charge or demond and take any fee for any service or services other than those expressly provided for by the said acts, such officer, in addition to any penalty or penalties to which by the existing laws he may now be subject, shall be liable to prosecution and punishment, by indictment, as for a misdemeanor in office any law or usage heretofore, to the contrary notwith-
