

The Foreign News.

The Collins steamer Baltic arrived at New York on Thursday, with one week's later news from Europe. There was a decline in cotton and breadstuffs. There was another relapse of rumors relative to peace negotiations, but nothing really reliable on the subject—it was all rumor. The Allies must abate their pretensions to superiority, and agree to pocket the loss sustained by the war, with not one inch of ground acquired to comfort their military prowess, before peace can be thought of by Russia. The Allies are now carrying a burden which must soon break their backs. The King of Sardinia has arrived in England, rumor says, in search of a wife. He is a very clever sort of a personage for a king; but though a Savoyard, will never make a Prince Eugene. His English wife, if he gets one, bids fair to cost him entirely too much, as she will probably be the price of bloodshed in the Crimea.—Nothing new from Asia, but Omar Pacha appears to be advancing into Georgia, where he will probably get a sound drubbing before he reaches Tiflis. Gen. Canrobert has left Copenhagen, but there is no account of his having effected a treaty of alliance with Sweden. Admiral Bruet of the Black Sea fleet, died of the cholera; so they have that enemy to help designate them. Count Mole has also gone to his final account.

EXPENSES OF CONGRESS.—The squabble for the predominance in the House, is well worthy the attention of politicians who are looking for public plunder. The following are the prizes for which there are about eight hundred applicants: The Speakership, \$16 a day; Public Printer, about \$75,000 worth of work (exclusive of paper) for the session; Clerk of the House of Representatives, \$3,000; Vice Clerk in his office, combined salaries, \$13,320; Sergeant-at-Arms, Doorkeeper and Postmaster of the House, \$6,480; Messenger, \$1,736 80; Librarian of the House, \$1,800; Reading Clerk, \$1,800; Clerk to the Sergeant-at-Arms, \$1,800; five Messengers for the Post Office of the House of Representatives, \$7,200; Chaplain of the House, \$750. Now for the contingent expenses: For binding documents, \$70,000; for furniture and repairs, (a good job for a cabinet maker,) \$3,000; for stationery for members, \$12,000; twenty one messengers, including superintendent of folding and document rooms, \$28,413; for engraving and lithographing, \$50,000; for messenger in charge of the hall, \$1,740; for two messengers in clerk's office, \$300; laborers, \$2,500; pages, (boys) \$5,936; for folding documents, including pay of folders, etc., \$20,000; draughtsmen and clerks \$9,000; binding Congressional globes, \$6,940. Besides other various "contingencies," to be supplied by friends of the dispensing parties.

REMARKABLE NEEDLE CASE.—About ten years ago, a daughter of James Morgan, residing near St. Mary's, Chester county, aged eight years, accidentally trod on a cushion of needles, while running over the floor; a number of them were left remaining in her foot, unknown to her parents or medical attendant. She felt no inconvenience in the interim, with the exception of slight periodical attacks, which were supposed to be rheumatism. Dr. E. B. Heckel was called in a few days ago to treat the case. Upon examination he found some foreign body lodged on the upper part of her foot, near the ankle joint. On cutting down he extracted fifteen large needles, of assorted sizes, presenting different positions. They are now in his possession, and can be seen by any one calling at his office. What is most singular, the eye of each needle is wanting, otherwise they are perfectly sound, with the exception of being a little rusted.—Pottsville Ledger.

VALUABLE DISCOVERY.—A correspondent of the Reading Journal, writing from Morgantown, says that a large body of "red hematite" Iron Ore has been discovered on the southern part of the farm of Mr. David Plank, at the foot of the Welsh Mountains, about one mile and a half from that village. It is not more than seventeen feet under ground, and in a situation that renders it easily worked. It is not often that this kind of ore is found in Pennsylvania, and this unexpected discovery has attracted much attention. It has been tested and found to be very pure, yielding more iron in proportion to its weight, than any other that has been discovered in the State.

BRADSTUFFS.—Speaking of the prevailing high prices of breadstuffs and the immense supplies for exportation which the country is capable of affording, the Buffalo Courier remarks: There is hardly any limit to our surplus of wheat and corn, and if the demand abroad should carry 100,000,000 bushels, which is almost four times as much as we have ever exported in one year, there would still be an abundant supply for home consumption.—Strange as it may seem, that with a large surplus on hand, fully equal to supply the demand from abroad, prices should rise so high; it is, nevertheless, in obedience to a law of trade, which makes a sudden impulse push the market values beyond a due limit, as well as to another law of trade which makes a derangement in the ordinary channels of supply produce, for a time, all the consequence of an actual scarcity.

PRAIRIE FIRES.—At Bloomington, Iowa, for the last three weeks, the skies have been rendered so brilliant by the burning prairies, that pedestrians have been able to make their way safely and pleasantly, without other light, in very cloudy nights, with no moon. These fires may be seen in a cloudy night, a distance of twenty or thirty miles across the prairies, lighting up the heavens half-way up the zenith, with the most gorgeous colors, and as changeable, almost, as those of the kaleidoscope.

Accident. The train due here at 2:45 P. M., on Saturday last, did not arrive until 4 P. M. It was detained by an accident below Parryville. The engine "Elizabethport" ran over two horses belonging to Mr. Bowman, which threw it from the track down an embankment, where it capsized. The coupling broke, leaving the passenger cars on the track; the passengers escaped with slight bruises.—Mauch Chunk Gazette.
