A Westbury, Vt., subscriber of the New England Farmer thus writes about the effect of bone dust :--

Farmer thus writes about the effect of hone dust: --I see a great deal in your paper about the use of hone dust or four. I have thought a good many times I would give you a little of uny syngerience in that matter. In 1844 I lived in a house of an hode-peutent former, and planted about three-fourths of an arce of corn on a pine plain. That firmer had been for many years gathering all the old bones he could find. That spring he earried them to a plas-ter mill.and got them ground. He gave me a peck of the flour, which I put on one-half of my piede of eorn. It had a wonderful effect. The stalks grow a foot taller than on the other half, and were dark-er colored, and the ears were from two to four inch-ee longer. The difference, hough, the season was such that the passers by often colled upon me to know what made the difference, I could only tell them that dry bones did it. The farmer experimented with it by putting bone on two rows, plaster of Parlaon the adjuining two,

on two rows, plaster of Parison the adj ining two, house ashes on the next two, then two with houting but the manure, which was applied a like to the whole let. Thus contrasted the effect was wonderful. field. Thus contrasted the effect was wonderful.-I am not able to give the exact difference in the yield in corn when harvested, as it has been so long, as a that I have forgotten; but I do remember very plainly how the corn look-d when growing; and that there was a very great difference in the appearance of the rows experimented with. If you think this somewhat vague recollection will be of any benefit to the public, you may publish it:
