

**THE BATTLE FLAG.**  
The following program was adopted:  
First. On the second of July, that the flag which will be deposited in Harrisburg...  
Second. The flag, when brought to Philadelphia, shall be deposited in some appropriate hall until the time of the presentation...  
Third. A military escort, with appropriate music, shall be provided to proceed with the flag and its guards of honor to Independence Square...  
Fourth. A proper person to be selected to present formally the flag to the Governor on the second of Independence Square...  
Fifth. Suitable music, vocal and instrumental, after the ceremonies of the reception of the flag...  
Sixth. Thanks to Almighty God for victory and triumph to our arms...  
Seventh. Proper music...  
Eighth. After the arrival of the flag in Independence Square a Governor's salute, and the salute of the entire military force...  
Ninth. At the conclusion of the ceremony the flag shall be conveyed to the hall from whence they were brought, where they will be kept until returned to Harrisburg...  
Tenth. It was unanimously resolved that Major General Meade be requested to present the flag...

A NEW PENSION BILL.—The Senate of the United States on the 18th inst., passed an amendment to the pension law which provides that all persons who shall have lost the sight of both eyes, both hands or been permanently and totally disabled for many years before being acquired with the service of the United States in the line of duty shall be entitled to \$25 per month and any person who shall have lost one foot and one hand, or both feet or other limbs or disabled to such an extent as to be unable to earn a living shall be entitled to \$20 per month. It is sincerely to be hoped that the House will immediately pass this bill and the President approve it so that justice will be done to the men who have sacrificed their lives for their country and received such injuries as forever prevent them from engaging in the active pursuits of life.
