SALT AND ASHES FOR ANIMALS .- A mixture of wood ashes and salt, three parts of the for-mer to one of the latter, constitutes an excellent mixture for all domestic animals. Its alkalescent and saline qualities are both congenial to the animal system and when used in proper quantities, and at proper times, are highly promotive of health.

APPLES.—Take firm, well-flavored apples, such as pippins, &c. Pare, quarter and boil until tender, but not so long as to break in pieces. Then add as much sugar as will sweeten to taste, and let the whole boil up once or twice. Fill the cans or jars, and seed as above. Few articles for winter desert or the tea-table will be found more delicate.-Fry a few cans.

QUINCES AND PEARS .- Take good preserv ing pears, peel and quarter them. and boil in a small quantity of water until tender.-Take about one-fourth the quantity of quinces, and do them in the same way. Then put both together, with as much sugar as will sweeton to taste, into a preserving kettle, and let them boil for three or four minutes -While boiling hot, pour into the cans or jars and seal.

STEWED APPLES .- Apples kept over for winter lose their perfect flavor, and the sumer luxury of 'stewed apples' is rarely enjoyed during the winter or spring. While apples are plenty and in fine flavor, stew them with sugar and seal them up. They will be as spicy and delidious at Uhristmus 48 in Sep-tember. A cheappr or more farming article tember. 
