It is a matter which concerns the people of the United States quite as much as any one, and the Senate ought to pass a vote of thanks to the press of the country for taking the pains to place either the full text or the main points of the Treaty before the people with such promptness.

Provinces is not very unarimous in either in-The press of the British North American dorsing or condemning the Treaty, but the drift of the expression in the Canadian and Provincial papers is adverse to the terms of the treaty. 
