Commercial Fertilizers.—Pertvian guano, will pay applied broadcast and harrowed in before sowing wheat. Use about 200lbs, per acre. It may be mixed with its weight or three times its weight, of plaster, usually with marked benefit. At the South, they use equal parts Peruvian and swan Island, or some good phos phetic guano, which supplies the place of the gypsum and add phosphoric acid. Fish manure and bone dust, applied at the rate of about 400lbs. of each, is a good substitute. Bone-dust is an excellent application to pastures at this season. Mix with equal parts good lively wood-ashes, pound the mixture solid, or moisten slightly, and after lying a week, shovel over on a floor, and break any cake lumps before sowing.
