## Agriculturalitems.

WORK FOR SEPTEMBER.

AUTUMN PLANTING of trees is best where there is likely to be a long, mild autumn, but where the winter shuts down suddenly, it is better to plant in spring. Next month the trees will be ready to remove from the nursery, and the ground should be prepared for their reception. A deep, well-drained, but not over-rich soil is best. Plow and subsoil, and if possible make the whole piece intended for the orchard so well are the nursery, and the ground should tended for the orchard so well prepared that a tree will grow in one place as well as in another.

AGRICULTURAL JOKES.—The Ohio Farmer lets of the following: Large horses are generally most

Because a man who attends a flock of sheep is a shepherd, makes it no reason that a man who keeps cows

should be a cow-ard. We like to see a farmer increase the growth of useful plants, and shrubs around his home, but do not like to see him use rails, poles, and boards to prop-a-gate with.

Many farmers have noticed in their fields a large black beetle, with most brilliant dots placed in rows on his back. Dr. Fitch says: "Its eggs produce the corn grub killer. It is a most inveterate foe to the cut-worm, grasping the worm in its strong jaws, and in spite of its violent writhing and struggles, securely holding it. When it finds these worms in plenty, it gorges and surfeits itself upon them till it is so glutted and extended as to be searcely able to stir, for it never knows how to let a cutworm alone when it meets him. It is continually hunting these worms, feeding on nothing else if it can obtain them. • Both it and the golden dotted beetle which produces it, therefore, should never be harmed."

----A correspondent of the Ohio Farmer states that the grape prospects all along the Lake shore region continue very good, though considerable damage was done to the vines around Sandusky by the recent storms. The dry, warm weather, for some time past, has been favorable to the growth of the vines and fruit. It is added that the prospects of peaches and apples in Lake and Ashtabula counties are quite fair. -----

The American Agriculturist tells a story of the means by which a farmer always succeeded in raising a larger and fatter hog than any of his neighbors wit w hom he was competing. It was found that he made use of jealousy as a tonic. After the big hog had caten all it wanted, he would let a poor little pig into the pen, when the fat one would fight it the other getting any food.

SHOEING HORSES. The necessity of the most careful shoeing of blooded horses has been shown in the ordeal through which Dexter has just passed, the king of the turf, whose feet during the winter have been badly contracted, which has just been satisfactorily overcome.

The proper shoeing of horses is a matter of great importance in all cases, but in those delicate hoofed highblooded trotters, it becomes a mater of importance both for speed and comfort. Mr. Bonner is so particular about the manner in which his horses are shod, that he always superintends the operation himself, remaining in the shop during the fiting and nailing of the shoes, both of which details he not only directs but even assists in personally.

As the perfect flatness of the shoe is necessary to easy and comfortable stepping, Mr. Bonner has procured a smooth and flat block of marble, upon whose surface he places every shoe, before it is nailed to the horses hoof. and if the iron does not lie plum on the stone, it is hammered and filed until a thoroughly level surface is obtained. He has also a theory about fastening a shoe. He makes the smith hammer the nails alternately on each side, stroke for stroke, nail by nail, left and right, so that the tightening of the shoe to the hoof is gradual and equal on both sides. He also has the shanks of the shoe stretched but little wider than the hoof; and by this system of driving the nails, the foot is brought to the shoe, and the frog and heel are expanded in the operation. The result is highly conducive to the soundness. and toughness of the hoof and the freedom and firmness of step in the animal.




