

THE UNITED STATES ARMY.—It appears from the official Army Register for 1838, that there have been the last year, forty-seven resignations of officers of the Army, viz: 1 Lieutenant Colonel, 13 Captains, 11 First Lieutenants, 17 Second Lieutenants, 1 Brevet Second Lieutenant, and 4 Staff.—Twenty-two deaths—of which number, six were killed in action with the Indians, in Florida, 1 Second Lieutenant resigned and 1 First Lieutenant dropped.—Total 71 officers lost to the Army in 1837.

The Baltimore Sun states that Richard P. Robison, the "great unchanged," of Helen Jewett memory, arrived recently in that city, on his way from Texas to New York. He travels under the name of Head, and since he has finished his career upon the rope, has raised an enormous pair of whiskers. He was, however, readily recognised on board of the Charleston packet, by several of the passengers.—Weekly Messenger.
