

STATEMENT

RECEIPTS & EXPENDITURES OF THE COUNTY OF COLUMBIA FOR THE YEAR 1842.

The Auditors elected to adjust and settle the Public accounts of the county of Columbia, together with the Commissioners, have examined the same from the first day of January, 1842, until the 31st day of December, of the same year, both days inclusive, and respectfully lay before the Hon. Judges of the court of Common Pleas, the following statement and report, agreeably to the 22d and 23d sections of an Act of the General Assembly, passed the 15th day of April, 1824.

RECEIPTS.
