Great Farm.

The United States Patent Office Report suys, "One of the greatest dairies in our country is that of Col. Meacham, of Pulaski, New York. His farm consists of onethousand acres, he keeps one hundred head of cattle, ninety-seven cows. In one year he made thirty thousand pounds of cheese, twenty thousand of which sold at one time in New York, for from six and a half to seven cents per pound. He feeds bie cows mostly on hay and carrots ; of the latter be raises two thousand bushels, and gives each cow half a bushel per day. And hesides the benefit derived from his grass for his stock, he gathers not less than three hundred bushels of grass seed.


