That every person, except justices of the peace, who shall hold any office of appointment of profit or trust under the government of the United States or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise. a subordinate officer or agent, who is or who shall be employed under the legislative executive or judiciary department of this state, or of the United States, or of any city or incorporated district and also that every member of Congress, and of the state Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incipable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or any appointment of judge or other officer of any election, shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for.

"No person shall be permitted to vote at any election as aforesaid other than a white freeman of the age of twenty one years or more, who shall have resided in this state at least one year, and in the election district in which he offers to vote at least ten days immediately preceeding such election, and within two years have paid a state or county tax which shall have been assessed at east ten days before the election. But a citizen of the United States who has previously been a citizen of this state and removed therefrom and returned and who shall have resided in the election district and paid taxes as aforesaid, shall be entitled to vote after residing in the state six months - Provided, That the free white freemen, citizens of the United States, between the age of twenty one and twenty two years and having resided in this state one year, and in the election district ten days as aforesaid shall be entitled o vote although they shall not have paid faxes."
