Resolved, That the Credentials of all persons claiming seats in this Convention, made vacant by the secession of delegates at Charleston, be referred to the Committee on Credentials, and said Committee are hereby instructed as soon as practicable to examine the same and report the names of persons entitled to seats.

The following changes were then made in this Committee, viz:

Mr. Boutwell, of Delaware, in place of Stout; Mr. Murrell, of Kentucky, in place of Wood; D. S. Gregory, of California, in place of Dudley.

Mr. Phillips then renewed his motion for a recess till 5 o'clock P. M.

Mr. McCook, of Ohio, demanded a vote by States, and the convention by a vote of 185 to 60, agreed to adjourn till 5 o'clock.
