FRENCH WHITE SOUP.—Boil a knuckle of veal and four calves' feet in five quarts of water, with three onions sliced, a bunch of sweet herbs, four heads of white celery cut small, a tablespoonful of whole pepper, and a small teaspoonful of salt, adding five or six blades of mace. Let it boil very slowly, till the meat is in rags and has dropped from the bone, and till the gristle has quite dissolved.
