AN INDICATION.—The Chester and Delaware Congressional District was the only one in the State in which a direct issue was made between the supporters of Breckinridge and Douglas. JOHN H. BRINTON, was nominated as the Breckinridge candidate, and P. FRAZER SMITH as the Douglas candidate. The result shows the utter insignificance of the Douglas party in a county where they have a straight-out organ, and where they made an open fight.

The following is the vote for member of Congress in Chester county: John Hickman, Republican, 7,103; John H. Brinton, Breckinridge, 5,670; P. F. Smith, Douglas, 3,950. In Delaware county the vote for Brinton exceeds that given to Foster 43 votes; and SMITH, the Douglas candidate, was nowhere in the contest.

After all the talk of the Douglasmen about the immense popularity of their candidate, and the necessity of adhering to him as the regular nominee, it turns out that he has no strength at all where his claims are subjected to the popular test. The only result accomplished by his adherents has been to weaken and defeat the Democratic party.
