

VICTORY IN WESTERN VIRGIN-

IA-ROUTE OF 2,000 REBELS.

CINCINNATI, June 3. Two columns of troops from Gen. M Clellan's command, by Col. Kelley, onsisting of the First Virginia Volunteers, and the other commanded by Col. Crittenden, and consisting of the Indiana Volunteers, left Grafton early last night, and after marching the entire night through a drenching rain, surprised a camp of rebels 2,000 strong at Philippa, Va., routed them completely, killing fifteen and captureing a large amount of arms, horses, amunition, provisions and camp equipage. The surprise was complete, and at last advices the United States troops were in a hot pursuit of the rebels. Probably many prisoners will be taken.

Col. Kelley was mortally wounded but will survive. Several of the United States troops were slightly wounded.

JMFF, DAVIS WILL HEAD THE TROOPS AT HARPER'S FERRY.

WASHINGTON, June 5, High official authority assures us that Jeff, Davis anticipates the first sanguinary conflict to be at Harper's Ferry. We are informed that he will head the troops in person.
