

SHEEP.

It is of more importance to the farmer than is generally supposed, that a certain portion of his farm stock should consist of sheep-Speaking of this point, R. S. Fay, of Linn, recently remaked at an agricultu ral meeting in boston, (as reported in the N. E. Farmer.) "Sheep are gleaners after other stock, and will keep the cattle pasture in good condition by being turned into them ocasionally to cat the coarser plants which have been left. They will enrich the land. There is no manure so fertilizing as that of the sheep, and it does not so readily waste by exposure as that of other animals. Sheep may be made exceedingly useful in helping to prepare land for a crop. A German agriculturist says that the dropings from one thousand sheep during a single night would manure an sere sufficiently. By that rule a farmer may determine how long to keep any given number of sheep on a particular piece of land. Mr. Fay said he was accustomed to fold his sheep upon land which he designed for corn and other crops; and in so doing he shut upon half an acre at a time, keeping them there by a wire fence which was easily moved from place to place. In this way his land was well manured without the labor of shoveling and carting."

These ideas are worth reading by the farmer. We believe any farm will bear a certain number of sheep, in proportion to the other stock, not only without loss to the amount of grazing which it will yield to the cattle and horses, but to the increase of the same. Mr. Fay, by his managment, makes the lambs and manure pay for keeping the sheep, and the wool is clear profit.

LIME EOR INSECTS .- According to the Northwestern Farmer, the use of lime pre-vents the ravages of insects. It gives the tatement of J. Baughman, of Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania, that "he had not failed in raising good crops of wheat and corn for the last twenty-five years, during all which time he has made free use of air-slacked lime-putting from two to three handred bushels upon an acre every four or five years-about one-half sown upon the land when the grain is sown, and the oth er when the grain is six or twelve inches high. He says that he has never, during the whole of that period, lost one bushel of grain, to his knowledge, by any bug or insect whatever, while those of his neighbours who did not make use of lime were He thinks the farmers of the West find a swell as the natural.

SETTING OUT PLANTS .- Most persons prefer setting out plants at evening, and when the ground is wet by rain. We prefer a dry soil, so that it will not be packed by tramping. When the hole is made, have a pint or more of water poured in Before the water all soaks away, the plant s set in, and the hole filled up with dry earth. Most of this is wet by the water, so that the plant is surrounded with moisture, e surface is left loose and open not packed or baked. We are certain that the trouble required is abundantly repaid, whether the number of plants be large or small.

LIME ON SEED POTATOES .- Several subscribers speak of good results from a method described in the Agriculturist some time ago, which was, to cut the potatoes, roll them in fresh lime, and let them lie six to ten days before planting. The reports are, that potatoes so treated sprout sooner after planting, grow more rapidly, and are not affected by rot. This looks reasonaple; the lime corrects acids in the cut tubers, and what is probably of most REMOVAL. utility, the alkalies assist in decomposing the organic matter around the seed, and thus immediately supply more nourishment.

Grease (say linseed oil, lard, &.,) penetrates the enemy, and destroys it in short order. Unless the skin of the animal be well rubbed and manipulated, the work will be only half done. Tobaco water is an injurious application, and should never be used as a wash upon cattle.-Germantown Telegraph.
