**GOOD SEED—EARLY WHEAT.**  
"What you sow, that you also reap." is as true in agriculture as in morals. It was once thought, and sustained by high authority, that imperfectly ripened wheat, if it would germinate, was as good as any for seed—and even recommended as better than good, plump kernels, as more seeds were contained in a bushel. Experience proves this notion fallacious. We may as well expect a full-sized Morgan horse from an imperfect seed. To produce the best we must propagate from the best.

In England, the farmers take the sheaves and whip them gently over a stone, when the best and earliest kernels will fall out, which they take for seed. A better method is to go through the field and select the earliest ripened heads for seed, which will soon produce an earlier variety than the original stock. Such seed will also produce a crop free from smut. Sowing poor, half-ripened, imperfect seed, is sowing smut and disappointment. It might seem that it would be an endless task to gather enough early heads for seed, but it requires but two or three years to change the variety, and have seed enough and to spare.

A wheat known in Scotland as the Hopetown wheat, and deemed an excellent and prolific variety, owes its origin to an accidental circumstance, an observing farmer having remarked a very superior ear, from which he picked out ninety nine kernels, and from their product came this celebrated variety.

To show the rapidity with which such seed may multiply, we give an instance:—A farmer in Cambridgeshire, England, in 1840, gathered eighteen very fine ears, the proceeds of which filled a common wine glass. The seeds he planted the following autumn, and produced one peck. This was planted the following autumn, and produced seven bushels and one peck, and this produced one hundred and eight bushels and two pecks, which was planted in 1843, and produced one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight bushels. This was the increase of eighteen heads of wheat in four years.

Another farmer planted thirty kernels in 1839, which produced fourteen and three-fourths bushels; this was sown, and produced one bushel and one peck; this produced forty-five bushels; and this, in 1841, produced five hundred and thirty-seven bushels.

It will thus be seen that the task of gathering the earliest ripened heads, and thus producing an earlier variety, is not great; and farmers will be well paid for their trouble. They will get a variety that can be sowed late enough to escape the fly, and that will still ripen early enough to escape the rust. Try it and give us the result.—Ohio Farmer.

**SALT AS TOOTH POWDER.**  
If, while examining under the microscope a drop of water containing infusoria, you introduce a grain of salt, the effect seen will be the instantaneous death of these creatures. The knowledge of this property of salt may be turned to account in several ways: among the rest, it suggests an excellent tooth-powder. If it be true, as asserted that the matter which is contained on the teeth is the receptacle of animalcules, and that these are the real agents in producing carious teeth, dip a moistened brush in common salt, and use it at once the cheapest and most preservative of tooth powders.

**SCAB IN SHEEP.**  
Yount recommends an ointment for this disease, prepared of common mercurial ointment, and three times its weight in lard, for very bad cases. Where the disease is light, or has just made its appearance, use five parts of the lard to one of the ointment. The ingredients are well rubbed together and the scabs are smeared with it. Another receipt for this disease is, one ounce of corrosive sublimate four ounces of sal ammoniac, dissolved in four quarts of rain water. This is a powerful stimulant, and should be used with caution. Well fed sheep, or those that run in dry hilly pastures, are seldom troubled with this disease.

**TO RIPEN LATE TOMATOES.**  
Hall's "Journal of Health" good authority—considers tomatoes "the most healthful of all vegetables," and adds: "The tomato season ends with the frost. The vines are pulled up before the frost comes, and hung up in a well ventilated cellar, with the tomatoes hanging to them, the 'love apple' will continue ripening until Christmas. The cellar should not be too dry nor too warm."
