Mr. WILLIAM SHAFFER, son of Samuel, had his leg broken on Tuesday last, near Bloomsburg, by his team running away.

A son of Jacob Demor Esq., of Madison Township, also had a similar accident before him this week.

A rather serious accident happened on Friday last, at Mc City, Neal and Co's Furnace, by the falling of a scaffold some twenty-five feet, inside of the stack upon which five or six workmen were engaged. The whole party were badly broken and jarred; but no bones were broken save the splitting of a knee-joint of Samuel Jacoby. The names of the injured men, as far as we are informed, are: Christian J. Knapp, Samuel Jacoby, John Kestley, John Herring—Star of the North.

A suit has just been decided in the state of New Jersey which is of interest to all who travel by railroad. The action was brought by Mr. Sullivan against the New Jersey Railroad company to recover the value of a trunk put on the cars and lost. The defense was that the trunk had been placed on the train by an irresponsible porter, without being placed in charge of and checked by the baggage master. The jury, however, under the instructions of the court, thought the plea set up in the case by the defendant insufficient, and rendered the verdict for the plaintiff for the full amount of the value of the trunk and its contents.

The annual report of the Pennsylvania Colonization Society considers the practicability of the removal of the colored race from America to Africa. We publish the following extracts:

The census of 1890 gives the number of free colored persons at 489,704, and slaves at 1,069,813, making a total of 1,559,517. If the colored returns obtained from the State Department at Washington, it appears that from 2,000,000 to 3,000,000 of the colored population of this country might emigrate to Africa or elsewhere, within a half more than a single year, and that the entire body of people of color, with the free ones, might number in less than twenty years—Two millions or 2,000,000, of the amount recently voted by Congress for war purposes, would be sufficient to cover the expenses of the passage of these emigrants to Liberia, and also to pay for six months of their support after arriving in that country.

So much has been said and written about the oil springs that we hardly know if any thing new can be told; but here are a couple of paragraphs at least new, and apparently true—

The editor of the Messer Dispatch gives a description of an extraordinary vein of oil tapped the other day on the McEhany farm, at a depth of four hundred and sixty feet. He says: A well was laid which it ran into a tank, holding, by measure, one hundred and eight barrels, and it flowed the same in fifty five minutes. At a fair estimate, taking this as a data, those who were working and watching about it are confident that in the first twenty-four hours, it flowed two thousand four hundred barrels of oil! And when we left on Friday morning there appeared to be but little diminution. What is also remarkable is the fact that this well is located not more than twenty rods from the Fank well, which has been flowing some four months, and has yielded an almost incredible quantity of the greasy fluid. It would have been supposed that the latter had drained all the oil for a considerable distance around, but here it is one still more prolific within twenty rods. These oil wells are certainly among the wonders of the world.

A geologist named Benton, who visited the Canadian oil springs in January, says: "It is a common idea, even with geologists, that the oil has been produced from beds of coal, but this oil field is sufficient of itself to show the incorrectness of the notion. The limestone found in this region under the drift clay, I recognize as a member of the Hamilton group of the Devonian formation, and as such is geologically many thousand feet below the lowest member of the carboniferous formation, below which workable coal beds are never found. The truth is, that this oil, found so abundantly in Canada, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and many other localities, is not coal oil, but oil derived from a recent source."

Prof. as it was collected from the impure waters of the early oceans by minute coral polyps, it has been driven by heat and pressure into reservoirs and crevices, where man's ingenuity is discovering it day by day. I have in my possession many specimens of this fossil coral, with oil plainly visible in the cells."
