LATEST WAR NEWS.

From the Army in Front of Richmond.

A Quiet Sunday—Brisk Skirmish on Saturday—Beware of Bragg at Montgomery, enroute for Richmond—Bragg to Kregel Hat etc.—Another fight on James Island—Severe loss on Both sides.

General McClellan's Head-quarters, Sunday, June 22, 8 P. M.—This has been a remarkably quiet day, considering the close proximity of the two contending forces.

The Richmond papers of yesterday contain a despatch from Montgomery, Ala., dated the 19th inst., stating that general Beauregard and staff had arrived there on their way to Richmond, and it was said that they were to be followed by a large portion of the army of the Mississippi, and that a sufficient force had been left under the invincible Bragg to check any advancement of the Vandale under Halleck.

The Charleston Mercury of the 18th, gives a graphic description of an engagement on James Island the previous Sunday, in which it acknowledges a severe loss on both sides, without any material change in position.

THE LATEST FROM RICHMOND. Despatch from General McClellan. Washington, June 21.—The following despatch was received at the War Department, this afternoon:—

Head-quarters of Army of the Potomac, June 21, 1862.—Hon E. M. Stanton, Secretary of War:—Things are now pretty quiet to-day. There is not as much shelling as usual. Our preparations are progressing well. The enemy opened with some heavy guns yesterday but did no harm.

Washington, June 21.—No later advices than those published, relating to matters of public interest, have been received at the War Department up to this hour, 11 o'clock P. M.
