From the Army. LATEST WAR NEWS.

The Latest from Gen. McClellan's Army.

The Latest from Gen, McClellan-Official Dispatches received-Our troops not Beaten in a single encounter-Only twenty-fice guns last - Seventeen Gunboats in James River-Fourth Celebrated by a grand review.

WASHINGTON, July 5 .- Dispatches have been received from General McClellan, dated as late as one o'clock, P. M., on Friday the Fourth of July.

The following is their substance, omitting military details and operations not proper for present publication.

There has been no fighting since Tuesday night, when the enemy were repulsed with great slaughter.

The army moved to the position since occupied, because it affords greatly superior advantage for the co-operation of the gunboats, of which seventeen are now in the river, protecting the flanks in the ar-

Statements of the casualities of the eight days fighting cannot be furnished. Our forces were not beaten in any con-

flict, nor could they be driven from the field by the utmost efforts of the enemy. The conduct of the troops in every command and under all circumstances, was

No guns linve been lost since the engagement on Friday, June 27th, when General McCall's division was at the onset overwhelmed by superior numbers, and twenty five pieces fell into the hands of the enemy. The sick and wounded are being sent

Rebel Account of the Battle on Monday

Hill and Longstreet, with their divisions crossed the Chickahominy, and late on Monday afternoon attacked the enemy about five miles northeast of Dartown, on the New Market road. The conflict was terrible, and half-past 8 o'clock the enemy had been driven a mile and a half. At halfpast 9 o'clock, the enemy being heavily reinforced, made another stand. The loss on our (the rebel) side was terrible, 'I he situation being evidently powerless against such overpowering forces, Gen. Hill slow-

ly retreated, amid the vociferous cheers of the Yankees.
