GRAIN AT CHICAGO.

A late correspondent at Chicago writes as follows ; Fifty-five million bushels of and latest fashions grain have been received here during the Calices. twelve months just ended, which is nincteen million more than any previous year. A gentlemen who lives in the interior of our State, told me this week that he had a large quantity of corn, and that it would cost him four cents per bushel to shell it, and six cents to haul it to the railroad, and that at the largest price he could get for it, (eight cents,) he should be two cents per bushel worse off than if he should give it all away in the cribs. In such regions, corn in the ear is being used for fuel, as much cheaper than cool. Our pork packing season is only half over, and there have been already cut up 200,000 hogs, (whole number last year, 231,000,) which is a steady increase from 48,000, ten years sgo. SALT FOR FATTENING SWINE.

Correspondent of the Annalen des CA Dandwirthschaft states some interesting experiments to test the use of salt in futening swine. He selected two pairs of barrow hogs, weighing 200 pounds apiece. One pair seceived, with their daily allowance of food, two ounces of salt; the other pair, similarly fed, none. In the course of a week it was easily Suga seen that the salted pair had a much stronger appetite than the others, and after a fortnight it was increased to two ounces apiece. After four months the weight of the salted hogs was 350 pounds each, while that of the unsalted, five weeks later, reached only 300 pounds. The experiment was repeated with almost precisely the same results. The author feeds young pigs, accordingly to their age, a quarter of an ounce daily ; breeding sows very little during pregnancy. and during the heat of summer withholds it in a great degree from all, as it induces thirst and liability to disease.

CURING PORK.

Farmer & Gardener.

A French chemist has lately asserted that scurvy will never arise from the' use of salt provisions, that salt alone snsweres all purposes provided the animal heat be entirely parted with before salting. He claims that the insertion of pork in pickle alone is not sufficient, but that it should be rubbed thoroughly with dry salt ofter it has entirely parted with its animal heat, and that then the fluid running from the meat should be poured off before packing the pork in the barrel. This should be done sufficiently closely to admit no unnecessary quantity of air, and some dry salt should occupy the space between the pieces, and then pickle, and not water, should be added .-Great care must be taken to fill the barrel entirely full, so that no portion of the meat can at any time project above the Groceries, surface of the fluid; for, if this occur, a change of flavor ensues such as is known with rusty pork.

The pickle, of course, must be a saturated solution of salt and wates, that is so strong that it is incupable of dissolving more salt. In must be remembered that cold watter is capable of disolving more salt than hot water .- Farmer & Gardener.

PRUNNING THE GRAPE.

While there are several good ways of prunning the grape, the following we regard as commendable. It was stated at a recent horticultural meeting to be the mode of the speaker :

"Whether 1 pruned in the autum or spring I would leave at least three buds to a spur; the lower bud for the purpose of making a new cane, the middle bud to be rubbed out, and the third bud for producing the fruit.
