GARDEN WORK FOR MAY.

As no time is now to be lost, and we have no special suggestions to make in regard to preparatory labors, we proceed at once to state what yet remains to be done.

Setting out Cabbage plants.—Prepare a bed by manuring it heavily; dig the manure in deep, rake the soil very fine, and when this is accomplished set out the plants in a row, three feet apart, the plants being two feet apart in the rows.

Sowing cabbage seed.—Early during the month sow cabbage seed, for a supply during the winter. For this purpose the Savory is one of the best varieties.

Parsnips, Carrots, and Beets.—Drill in a supply of these early in the month for winter use.

Radish Seed.—Sow radish seed at intervals of ten days for a succession of crops.

Lettuce.—Plant out young plants for heading and sow seed at intervals of ten days or two weeks.

Peas.—Drill in a few rows of peas every few weeks to provide for a regular progressive supply. As the season advances choose the cooler and shadier portion of the garden for this purpose.

Beans.—Plant a few rows of bunch beans.

Mellons of all kinds.—They should be planted during the first week in May.

Squashes—Cucumbers.—Plant these also early in the month.

Corn for Roasting ears.—Marure, dig and plant a sufficient space of ground for an early supply of corn for the table.

Cauliflower.—Sow out cauliflower plants for early use, and sow cauliflower seed for a late supply.

Lima Beans.—These should be sown as early in the month as the ground is warm enough to receive them.

Small Salading.—Sow the seeds of all kinds of small salading at intervals of ten days.

Celery plants.—Set these out, and sow celery seed for a late supply.

Onions.—Keep the onion sets free of weeds, and water freely in dry weather.

Egg plants.—Such plants as have been raised in hot beds should now be planted out. The seeds or plants to come in later may now be sown in the open air.

Red Peppers.—Prepare a bed in a warm, southern order, and sow the seeds of the red peppers.

Tomatoes.—Plant out tomato plants raised in frames, and sow the seeds in the open air for a further supply.

Raspberries.—New plantations of this fruit may be made early in the month, but in setting out, the ground should be mulched about the plants.

Strawberry beds.—In dry weather, after sunning, freely and frequently water strawberry beds. By observing the precaution never to apply water whilst the sun is shining, no fear need be entertained of injuring the blossoms.

SOILED CARPETS.
